

## **Statement of Completion Intellectual Property Law**

Second and third year students may develop expertise in intellectual property law. The requirements for the Intellectual Property Law Statement of Completion are the following:

1. Students must satisfactorily complete three required courses:

- Copyrights
- Patent Law and Policy
- Trademark Law

2. In addition, students must satisfactorily complete a total of two courses selected from the following list:

- Art Law
- Cybercrime
- Intellectual Property Law Survey
- Intellectual Property Licensing
- Patent Litigation
- Intellectual Property Management Strategies

3. Students must also take one of the following courses:

- Administrative Law
- Antitrust

4. Students must also complete an academic research paper of high professional quality concerning intellectual property law. They may fulfill this requirement in conjunction with a course or seminar. The paper must be equivalent in depth and quality to the law school's Writing Requirement, and may be used to satisfy that requirement. Advance approval of the topic is required.

While not required, it is helpful to have taken the foundational courses (Copyrights, Patent Law and Policy, Trademark Law) prior to taking elective courses. The elective courses assume a fundamental level of knowledge about intellectual property law.
