

Statement of Completion International Law

Second and third-year students at the School of Law are eligible to begin developing a specialty in the field of International Law. The following are the requirements for the International Law Statement of Completion:

1. Students must satisfactorily complete:

- International Law, and
- *either* International Business Transactions *or* International Trade and Investment Law

2. In addition, students must satisfactorily complete a total of four courses selected from the following list:

- Comparative Environmental Law
- Conflicts of Law
- European Union Law
- Global Environmental Challenges
- Human Rights
- Immigration Law
- International Environmental Law
- International Business Transactions
- International Trade and Investment Law
- Refugee and Asylum Law

3. Other courses may be substituted for any of the above courses with the prior approval of a member of the International Law Certificate Committee or the Associate Dean of Academic Affairs.

4. Students must complete an academic research paper of high professional quality concerning international law issues. They may fulfill this requirement in conjunction with any of the above-listed courses and seminars, or through one of the school's journals or legal writing offerings. The paper must be equivalent in depth and quality to the school's Writing Requirement. Advance approval of the topic is required.

While not required, it is strongly recommended to have taken the foundational course (International Law) prior to taking elective courses. The elective courses assume a fundamental level of knowledge about international law in general.
